Last week was an incredibly busy week getting to know each other, learning classroom rules and procedures, and reviewing third grade standards. In Language Arts, A.R. tests are open for students to take during the school day. Your child should earn a minimum of 2-3 points per week to meet his/her monthly goals. 
In other news, the Book Fair is here! Our class will visit the book fair this Friday, however, it will be open to students every day during recess and after school to preview or purchase books.

This Week's Math and Social Studies Standards / Test Dates

This week in Math, students will begin Topic 3: Place Value. Students will learn to read and write numbers up to six digits. They will also compare numbers using the > (greater than), < (less than), and = (equal to) symbols, order numbers, and round. This week's poem, "The Rounding Rap," should help them with this tough concept. (ie: What is 1,836 rounded to the nearest hundred?). The Topic 3 test will be given next Wednesday. Throughout the course of the school year, the students will switch between studying Science or Social Studies (History). We have started working

with Social Studies, and will remain on the subject until the first full unit is complete. Last week, we extensively covered accessing the Table of Contents, glossary, index, vocabulary terms, headings, and lesson summaries. This week, our class is discussing California's global location in relation to the equator, prime meridian, hemispheres, neighboring countries, states, and bodies of water. All Social Studies tests will be open-book!



Explanation Rounding Rap Example Underline vour number 1.836 (underline the place value) Look next door 1,83**6** (look at the number to the right of the underlined number) Five or greater, add one more 1,84**6** (if the number to the right is greater than 4, round the underlined number up one) Numbers to the left, stay the same **1,8**<u>4</u>6 (numbers to the left of the underlined number do not change) Numbers to the right, zero's your name! 1,8<u>4</u>0 (numbers to the right of the underlined number change to zero)
