


# Miss Hanrahan's Class Newsletter

In other news, some of our Social Studies and Reading assignments took a bit longer last week than planned for. As a result, please note that our test dates have shifted slightly for both subjects! The Benchmark Advance reading skills test will be this Thursday, but it will be completed whole-class, as it is far different than reading tests they have had in the past. The open-book Social Studies test will be moved to next Tuesday. Social Studies will be completed individually, so I highly recommend taking the textbook home as a study tool.

Also, this Friday, the ODD-numbered students will be responsible for memorizing and presenting the poem below! Even-numbered students will present a different poem next week. Late performers will be given the opportunity to present on Monday for HALF credit. If a student is not prepared at that time, they will earn zero points!

### This Week's Math and Social Studies Standards / Test Dates

This Wednesday, students will test on Topic 3: Place Value. As a reminder, all Math tests are open-note! Thursday we will begin Topic 4: Addition and Subtraction of Whole Numbers. In Topic 4, the students will learn to estimate sums and differences of whole numbers using the same Rounding Rap they learned in Topic 3. They will also work on adding and subtracting multiple numbers, up to six digits each. Your child will also focus on subtracting across zeros with regrouping, or "borrowing."

In Social Studies, we will discuss the major physical features of California, as well as the four natural regions of California (mountain, central valley, desert, coastal), their different elevations, natural resources, climates, animal life, and vegetation. The open-book Chapter 1 test will be next Tuesday, August 29th!
