## Dear Parents...

Last week was a busy one here at McKinley! We started our week with an incredible solar eclipse that our students were fortunate to witness with their kindergarten buddies (thanks, PTA for the donation of more than 700 solar glasses)! Later in the week, McKinley kids experienced a PBIS behavior tour of the school. The tour included presentations of McKinley student expectations in the hallways, cafeteria, office, playground, etc. I encourage you to discuss these expectations with your child to reinforce positive choices both in and out of the classroom.

As we advance into our second month of school, we fall into more regular 4th grade routines. To begin, the students' first grades have been posted to the Q online gradebook. Directions, usernames, and passwords were sent home in the Parent Information Night "Home Access" packet so that you may easily check your child's grades online. Students have also taken their iReady reading placements for Reading (the results of which will be sent home Friday), and are currently completing their Math placements. A.R. tests have also begun, as have our Wednesday lunches for unfinished work and retests. I am already so impressed with the proactive attitudes toward reading that I have witnessed over these first few weeks! Several students have chosen to read during their recess time in an effort to earn points, in addition to their nightly homework. Please keep up the hard work, and I look forward to the results of our fourth grade class reading competition!

# This Week's Math and Social Studies Standards / Test Dates

In Math, we will finish Topic 4: Addition and Subtraction of Whole Numbers. In Topic 4, the students learn to estimate sums and differences of whole numbers using the same Rounding Rap from Topic 3. This week, they will work on adding and subtracting multiple numbers, up to six digits each, and focus on subtracting across zeros with regrouping, or "borrowing. The Topic 4 test will be next Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup>!

In Social Studies, we will discuss the major physical features of California, as well as the four natural regions of California (mountain, central valley, desert, coastal), their different elevations, natural resources, climates, animal life, and vegetation. If your child would like to take their textbook home to study from, they may absolutely do so, but it is very important that they bring it back the following day for use on the test. The open-book Chapter 1 test will be Tuesday.
